

## Bond Street station western ticket hall works, update January 2019

Costain Skanska JV, Crossrail's contractor for the Bond Street station project, would like to take this opportunity to update you on the works taking place at the western ticket hall site.

We will shortly be undertaking a programme of urban realm works surrounding the western ticket hall. New perimeter hoarding will be erected at the junction between Davies Street, South Molton Lane, and Weighhouse Street.

The works will involve breaking out of concrete and asphalt from the existing road base and the removal of the kerbs and paving. The breakout of the road base will allow the installation of road gullies and connection to the sewer. This will be followed by the construction of a new road base and the replacement of the kerbs and paving. All works will be carried out within the site hoarding and will be expected to last 10 weeks commencing from 14 January 2019.

Following this, the hoarding will be removed and new paving will be installed up to the building faces. This will take approximately 4 weeks to complete.

Netting and acoustic screening will be installed to minimise visual and noise impacts to businesses and residents. The working hours are Monday to Saturday 08:00 – 18:00. We will also ensure there will be two respite periods (10:00 – 12:00 and 14:00 – 16:00) that will be free from noisy works.

We will continue to update you on the programme of these works in due course. We would like to thank you for your cooperation and we apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused as a result of these works.

### Duration of work



### What to expect

- Concrete and asphalt breaking
- Drainage and other utility connections
- Kerb and paving installations
- Asphalt laying

- Ensure that all personnel accessing and exiting the site are respectful of local businesses and residents
- Maintain public access to all businesses at all times
